LOCALS RETRACE FOREFATHERS' WORLD WAR 1 JOURNEY

Three horse riders are tracking the journey their forefathers took to enlist in World War 1. They started in Melbourne where they lit their lantern from the Eternal Flame at the Shrine of Remembrance.

An unfortunate incidence occurred on Punt Road as they were starting their 500+km journey. A ten tonne truck hit the horse and the horse retaliated by kicking the truck back (as you would) and he had to be trucked home due to injuries. The riders then zigzagged their way through county towns following the old Hume Highway.

PARVO (PARVOVIRUS) IN DOGS (ASPCA.ORG)

Canine parvovirus is a highly contagious viral disease that can produce a life-threatening illness. The virus attacks rapidly dividing cells in a dog's body and most severely affecting the intestinal tract. Parvovirus also attacks the white blood cells, and when young animals are infected, the virus can damage the heart muscle and cause lifelong cardiac problem.

The general symptoms of parvovirus are lethargy, severe vomiting, loss of appetite and bloody, foul-smelling diarrhoea that can lead to life-threatening dehydration.

Parvovirus is extremely contagious and can be transmitted by any person, animal or object that comes in contact with an infected dog's faeces. Highly resistant, the virus can live in the environment for months, and may survive on inanimate objects such as food bowls, shoes, clothes, carpet and floors. It is common for an unvaccinated dog to contract parvovirus from the streets.

Puppies, adolescent dogs and canines who are not vaccinated are most susceptible to the virus. The canine parvovirus affects most members of the dog family (wolves, coyotes, foxes, etc.). Breeds at a higher risk are Rottweilers, Doberman pinschers, Labrador retrievers, American Staffordshire terriers and German shepherds.

You can protect your dog from this potential killer by making sure he's up-to-date (with annual injections) on his [vaccinations](#). Parvovirus should be considered a core vaccine for all puppies and adult dogs. It is usually recommended that puppies be vaccinated with combination vaccines that take into account the risk factors for exposure to various diseases.

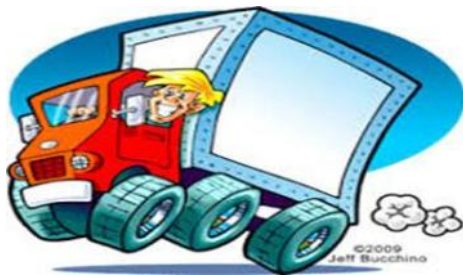

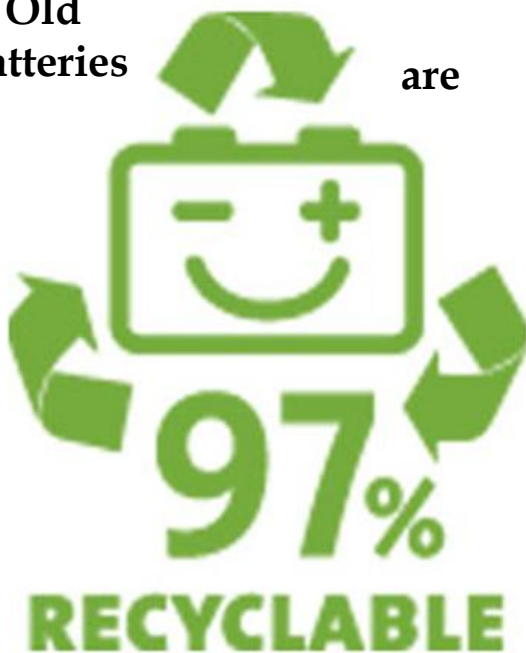
